"Psychics do best in their own home settings which afford maximum serenity and psychological stability. In addition, there is positive research value in having Huxley under observation in his daily life. For now one hints in contemporary research that certain kinds of 'psi' ability may be highly creative acts, involving the whole personality rather than merely a "with ease". To study this question requires studying the whole man in his authentic relationships in his daily life."

The first three years of research by the Foundation as formulated by Dr. Bro, is expected to include the following phases:

1. Developing a complete case history of myself, followed by research adapted to my indicated capacities.
2. Holding periodic conferences of the nation's top parapsychologists, to determine the direction of the research on gifted subjects.

3. Developing formulations of Theory of "psi" much needed in the field of parapsychology today, and eliminating the less useful theories.

4. Preparing annotated bibliographies which will assist in selecting the cooperation of scientists and other professional people.

5. Conducting pilot project experiments with unselected subjects, to attempt to translate findings from the Founder's work into other settings.

6. Developing a file of spontaneous cases of psychic experiences of many people, to offer leads for research.

7. Developing complete case histories and resultant experiments with other psychics who are willing to cooperate.

8. Working with research specialists in various fields: medical, technological, business, government, historical, geological, etc., to discover the best practical uses of psychical ability, and ways to develop and employ it in these fields.
