Anything Headquarters can do through proper channels to promote sponsorships will be much appreciated. The situation is discouraging to say the least. We recently came across a report stating shepherds were a vanishing type in the Western United States. Could this be investigated considering the numbers of Albanians in Greece knowing that occupation? The writer realizes full well we are not in the social welfare business, and we never get involved in commitments, nonetheless we cannot deny that there are some of our former personnel in Greece who left us on good terms who deserve more than life in a refugee camp. One possibility which we plan to reopen through proper channels and with due regard to current policy is JEPARSON.

7. Agent personnel on standby continue to maintain the following attitude. Let us act and act now in a bold fashion. The enemy have gained too much from the trials and their successes against us. The same thought was reported to Sacavage by Kafthanos one of the most intelligent of the recent arrivals.
