*Excerpt of pertinent information

"General ONODERA General Onodera was the chief Japanese intelligence officer in Sweden. He had the reputation of being a particularly capable man. Exchange of information between him and the GIS was handled via the German Air Attache, Obst von Heymann, and the military attache, General von Uthmann. The information received from the Japanese which went through Busch's hands was not worth anything.
"Busch is of the opinion that an outstanding man like Onodera would not waste his time in a place like Stockholm to gather intelligence in a routine manner. He believes that Onodera's primary aim in Stockholm was to maintain political contact with the Russians.
"Busch is ignorant of Kraemer's frequent dealings with Onodera.
"When asked whether the Japanese had an espionage net in Sweden, he replied that he hardly thought so.
"As a point of interest, one detail is added here which Voeczkoendy furnished on Onodera. One of the most valued Japanese sources in Stockholm was the advance copy of the Stockholm edition of Time magazine which Onodera received regularly four days ahead of publication. Extracts were radioed to Tokyo and Voeczkoendy understood that this information was very useful to the Japanese General Staff."
