It is my desire, and I hereby direct, that all reder I foreign intelligence activities be planned, developed and accordinated soles to assure the most effective accomplishment of the intelligence mission related to the national security.  2. Within the limits of averlable appropriations, you show each from time the time assign persons and facilities from your respective Departments, which persons and I collectively form a Central Intelligence Group and shall funder the direction of militerator of Central Intelligence, assist the National Intelligence Authority. The Director of Central Intelligence in the Mational Intelligence Authority, and shall sit as a non-voting member thereof.
 - 3. Subject to the existing law, and to the direction and control of the National Intelligence Authority, the Director of Central Intelligence shall:
 - a. Accomplish the correlation and evaluation of intelligence relating to the national security, and the appropriate dissemination within the Government of the resulting strategic and national policy intelligence. In so doing, full use shall be made of the staff and facilities of the intelligence agencies of your Departments.
 - b. Plan for the coordination of such of the locker-ties of the Intelligence agencies of your Departments as relate to the national security and recommend to the National Intelligence Authority the establishment of such over-all policies and objectives as will assume the most effective accomplishment of the national intelligence mission.
 - c. Perform, for the benefit of said intelligence agencies, such services of common concern as the Mational Intelligence Authority determines can be more efficiently accomplished centrally.

- d. Perform such other functions and duties related
 to intelligence affecting the national security as
 the President and the National Intelligence Authority
 may from time to time direct

Within the scope of existing law and Presidential directives, other departments and agencies of the executive branch of the Federal Government shall furnish such intelligence information relating to the national security as is in their possession, and as the Director of Central Intelligence may from time to time request pursuant to regulations of the National Intelligence Authority.
 - 9. Nothing herein shall be construed to authorize the making of investigations inside the continental limits of the United States and its possessions, except as provided by law and Presidential directives.
 - 10. In the conduct of their activities the National Intelligence Authority and the Director of Central Intelligence shall be responsible for fully protecting intelligence sources and methods.
