lo It has come to our attention that a letter signed by General | Nicolan Redescu as President of the Langue of Pres Comments addressed to the State Attorney, Berne, Suiteerland, charging Constantin Viscient and Alexandry Cretcians with criminal action with respect to the "searct funds." On the basis of this letter, considered as new evidence, the Russnian communist government has brought a criminal suit against Creteiann although the Swiss courts have in previous instances ruled in Cretziams's favor and rejected efforts to reopen a civil suit on this issue. A translation of the letter is attached.

- 2. Radeson states in his letter that the "public" funds were not legally transferred and that they should be "restored to all the Russian intellectual exiles." If the Swiss court decides on the basis of Radesou's statements that these are public funds, it will order them handed ever to the Rumanian People's Republic and the stiles will receive nothing. The allegations made in Radescu's letter as to the dates of the transfer of the funds are the same as those made by the Rusardan communist government in the swit in May 1950.
- 3. Radescu has made these charges both in enigre newspapers controlled by his supporters and orally in the past - but this is the first time, to our knowledge, that he has attempted to present these charges in court, although the previous trials effered opportunity for such setion. He has contended that the funds should be dispessed by a refugee group (his, preferably) for the support of indigent refugees. Cretains has maintained that his is the sole responsibility and that in order to obtain the greatest benefit for Rumania, the funde should be spent for publications and refugeo activities that will keep Rumania's plight before the world. However, he has occasionally let certain refugees, including Radecou, have sume for their own use. Cretaintu believes that if the funds were used for charitable support purposes, they would soon be gone (pert are blocked in Seiteerland), the refugees would again be penniless and the country's cause no further advanced. Cretzianu has also invited an examination of the accounts by an impartial certified public accountant.

he Radeson's attitude on the fund and his "moral" indignation are believed to have been fermed and strengthered by his close followers and personal advisors. It is unlikely that Radassus bimself propered this latter; he may have signed it without being fully saure of the implications. In addition, it should be noted that this latter was forwarded to Suiteerland at a time when the MCFE had assured us that the Ceneral's activities with respect to the League of Free Russmisss had been surtailed in the interest of refuges unity.

5. In view of Redmon's complicity, intentional or otherwise, in the affair of the letter and his disregard of MCFE's request for ecoparation, his participation in a united Rumanian refugee organization no longer appears his participation in a whited Humanian reruged organization no longer appears desirable. It is suggested, therefore, that no further efforts be made to obtain his consent to an honorary position. The Department of State is his agreement with this wiew. It is further requested that Radesou, Darbe Moules gonetambly Tiscianu, Askandru Cretainu, Bail Vidlesse, Arste Costo, Mikel Fureasenu and Grigory Galemou be informed that the reasen for his emclusion is his irresponsibility and his giving aid to the communist government of Rumania.
