## MEMORABIUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF STATE

## Subject: Reciprocal Agreement with the British Breadcasting Corporation Monitoring Service

Moring the war, the Foreign Broadcast Intelligence Service (now a branch of the Central Intelligence Group) had an infermal reciprocal agreement with the Monitoring Service of the British Broadcasting Corporation whereby foreign breadcasts intercepted by the two countries would be freely interchanged. The purpose of the agreement was to effect economics by dividing the job of worldwide monitoring and eliminating unnecessary duplication. The British Broadcasting Corporation is providing us with the product of its European monitoring; in return, we are giving them a relatively small file of Niddle Bastern broadcast material which is intercepted by our Foreign Broadcast Information Branch at Caire.

We understand that the British are interested in equalizing the reciprocal agreement by having the Foreign Broadcast Information Branch also provide them with monitored material from the Far Hast and Latin America in return for the extensive Baropean service it is providing this Government in the interest of our listening post in Cairo is questionable. Lebanon, Syria, and Cyprus present possible alternates. We desire to enter into a working arrangement whereby we would make available to the British, in London, our product of Far Hastern, Latin American and Middle Hastern monitoring in return for the continuation of the present British Broadcasting Corporation Baropean coverage plus their aid in effecting a transfer from Caire to a suitable Middle Hast location, preferably Cyprus.

It is proposed that we confer with the State Department to discuss the proper procedure to follow in negotiating such an agreement with the British. Mr. Russell M. Shepherd, Chief, Foreign Broadcast Information Branch, will represent the Central Intelligence Group on this matter. It would be appreciated if your designated representative would call Mr. Shepherd on Branchive 5115, extension 2927, to arrange a meeting for a discussion of further details pertaining to the desired reciprocity.
