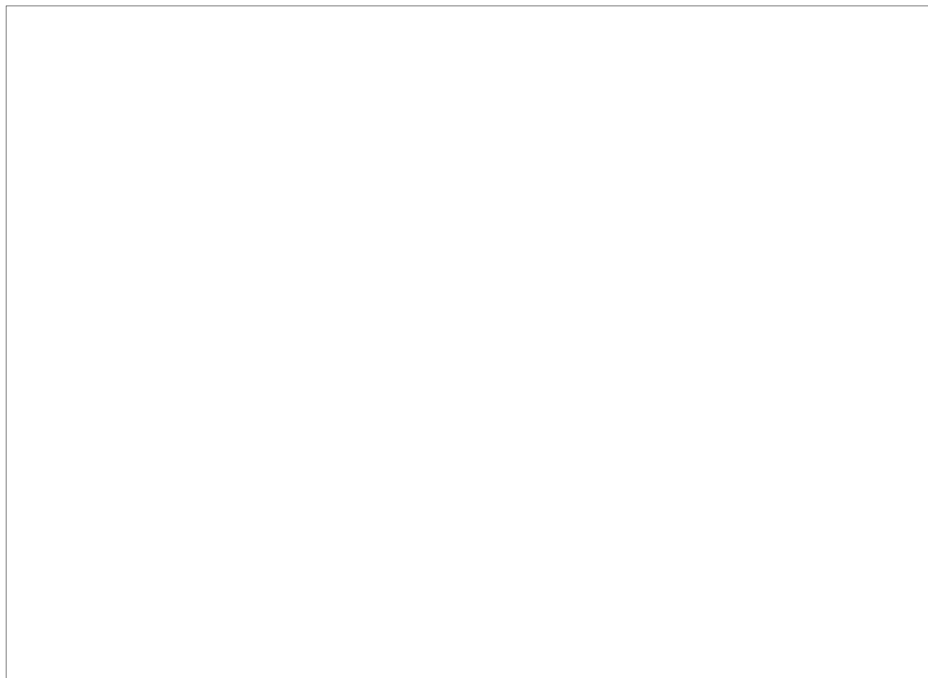


(U) [redacted] People [redacted] Cars, 500 Balloon Animals, and 155 Pounds of Bacon: Family Day 2014

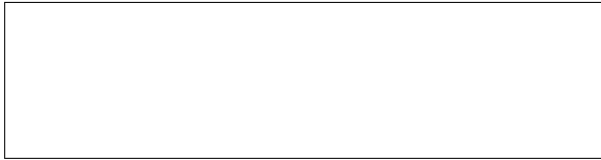

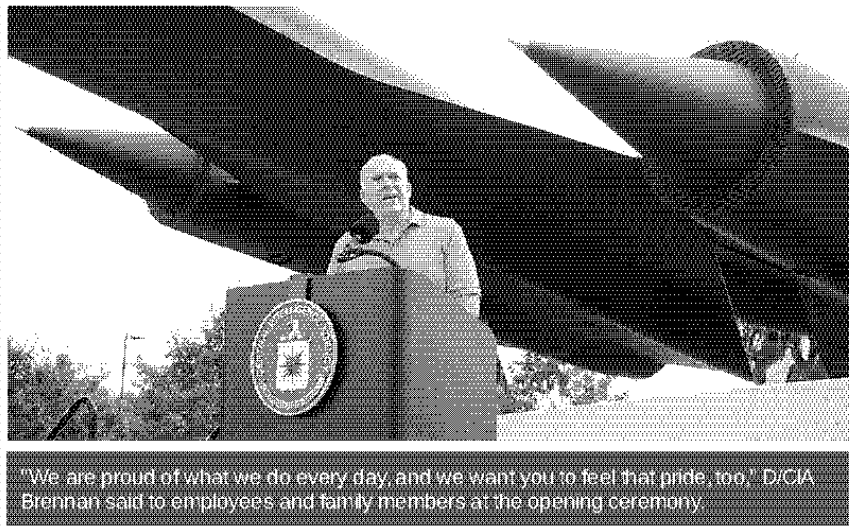
