<p>1. ZIPPER reports that according to an article in the Salzburger Nachrichten on 23 June 55, 186 persons were to arrive on 25 June in Wiener Neustadt from the USSR. ZIPPER went over the list and came up with the following persons of interest to the intelligence community. POB traces are also included.</p> <p>....</p> <p>H. Armin RENTMEISTER, born 1923, known from Angelegenheit "IWAN". POB traces: born 15 Feb 1923, resided Wien VII, Neubaugasse 48, missing since 9 Mar 1953 (EAV-891). Dropped 10 Feb 1953 according to dropped list (EGQA-13660, 6 Apr 53). Angelegenheit "IWAN" refers to the Ludwig BRUNNER affair (PULL-0009, 2 Mar 55) where BRUNNER, a self-confessed SRIS agent claimed to have participated in the abduction of RENTMEISTER. Furthermore it appears Herbert DEISENHARTNER (EAVA-6803 and EGLA-8936) submitted reports to RENTMEISTER who was at one time employed by Det. 35. Also it was reported that BRUNNER was turned over to RENTMEISTER for exploitation. Subject was also a close friend of Hans DEINL and disappeared one day before both were scheduled to testify against Erich HOLETZ. POB files also indicate that RENTMEISTER was one of the sources of rumors on the whereabouts of Johann SANITZER.</p> <p>....</p> <p>...."</p>
