S- believed in making use of a "brain trust" not on the Party  
or Government payroll, and wished to hire Giselher Wirsing, q.v.,  
for this purpose; S-'s theory was that the "free specialists"  
would be more dependable if attached to him not by official but  
by personal bonds; M-"has no idea" as to how far Schellenberg's  
relation with Wirsing and other potential "braintrusters" develop-  
ed; recruitment of such persons was largely left to Schellenberg's  
subordinate, Luftwaffe Oberfeldrichter Schoen, q.v.

M- first met S- ca. July '44 at dinner with Six and Personal Refer-  
ents of Six and S-; subject of dinner: possibility of separate  
peace with England and US

SCHELLENBERG, Walter: Born 1910. Worked in occupied Holland, inter alia in the Central Department for Jewish Emigration in Amsterdam; was involved in the deportation of civilians; in 1943 and 1944, as SS-Standartenfuhrer and later Oberfuhrer, he was Head of Department VI (Foreign Countries) of the Reichssicherheitshauptamt (Security Police and SD), with the rank of acting Oberregierungsrat; he was promoted Brigadefuhrer and finally Gruppenfuhrer. He was the "foreign minister" of the SS and played a very large part in negotiations concerning foreign countries, o.g. in Switzerland. During the final stages of the war he acted as intermediary between Himmler and Count Bernadotte; was extradited from Sweden in June 1945.

An American war-crimes court in a 2-1 decision announced today the conviction of 14 former Nazi government officials of crimes against humanity. Two defendants walked from jail today freed of all charges. They were Otto Meissner one-time Secretary of State for Presidential Affairs and Otto von Erdmannsdorff who was deputy chief of the Foreign Ministry political division. Both had been accused of offenses against the Jews. The court said Meissner's role in the Nazi program was "hardly more than that of a messenger." Von Erdmannsdorff was termed "little more than a chief clerk."

In the summer of 1944, S instructed Skorzeny to discuss an operation to assassinate Stalin with Ostuf Tschierschku of Amt VI-C and Stubaf Lassig of Amt VI-F. Amt VI-C had a Russian agent who, for personal and political reasons, was prepared to attempt the assassination. He was an engineer whose entire family, according to his story, had been killed by the Russians.

The plan is described in this document.

Skorzeny considered the whole operation fanatical and said so in no uncertain terms, consequently his relationship with Amt VI-C and Amt VI-F were permanently impaired.
