

As for Belmonte's position in the matter, it will be recalled that Theodor H. WIEHL, Head of Int. II-4, was quite certain that after the coup was accomplished the exiled leader was very much disinterested with its timing. It would now appear that the reason for this was that Belmonte was unable to get to Argentina in time to make a triumphant entry into the new government. He did not, however, desist in his efforts to obtain clandestine passage to South America; it was the ~~U.S.A.~~ itself which lost interest in Belmonte by the time the ~~U.S.A.~~ U.S.S.R. was finally equipped and sent out in mid-1944.

Office stamps on the back of Belmonte's letter show that it went on November 10 to Office of the Foreign Minister, although there is no indication whether or not Mr. ~~WIEHL~~ himself read it.
