The following is a translation of a squib which appeared in the newspaper ONT (printed in Toulouse; represents anarchist union group in exile), issue dated 28 January 1951:

A ROBBERY OF OTTO SKORZENY IN MADRID

MADRID, January (OPE).—Otto Skorzeny, chief of the Nazi parachutists who accomplished the rescue of Mussolini when he was prisoner, to take him to Germany, and who now lives in Madrid under an assumed name, has been the victim of a robbery.

The apartment that he occupies in Madrid with his wife, was broken into by mysterious visitors. It is still unknown whether the robbery had political motives. Officially Skorzeny is employed by an export-import firm.
