You will recall that captioned subject was Commanding Officer of a German Military Unit during World War II which kid-napped Mussolini after his capture by the Allies, and that subject engaged in sabotage and espionage missions against the Allies.

Information has been received from a confidential informant residing in the United States, whose reliability has not been established but who is in a position to furnish information concerning subject, that subject is residing in Madrid, Spain, with Countess Ilse Von Finklestein. Informant advised that recently Countess Von Finklestein had gone to a clinic in Hamburg, Germany, for treatment and she was accompanied by subject.

It will be appreciated if you would furnish this Bureau information in your files or information which you may develop concerning subject.
