- (C) The following information, received from the US Army Attache, Dublin, Ireland, is forwarded to your office as a matter of possible interest.
CIT ITALY *Re: info on OTTO SKORZENY*
- (C) The Army Attache, while attending a dinner party, was engaged in conversation by Dr. Paolo E. Mussa, Counsellor of the Italian Embassy, who mentioned the presence of Colonel Otto Skorzeny in Ireland. Dr. Mussa said that Skorzeny was still a "die hard" Nazi and no doubt the top man today in any organization connected with the former Nazi Party. He was sure that Skorzeny was an agent of some country other than the Soviet Union. Dr. Mussa appears to know more about subject than he was willing to discuss at the time. For example, he mentioned that the Colonel lived part of the time in Spain as well as in Ireland and indicated that there was something strange about his whereabouts from time to time.
- (C) The Army Attache has been advised of the release of his comments to your agency.
