SOUTH AFRICA-MOZAMBIQUE: Cooperation Increasing

South African President Botha and a seni or Mozambican official met last week and agreed to reconvene a join security commission; the meeting is indicative of a general improvement in bilateral cooperation. The two countries are discuising reopening the Cahora Bassa hydroelectric complex in northern Aozambique built to supply power largely to South Africa. Pretoria has agreed to equip and train 1,500 Mozambican troops to guard the transmission lines from attacks by RENAMO insurgents. Pretoria has also agreed to reschedule Mozambique's small bilateral lebt, while Mozambican President Chissano recently held talks with a prominent South African businessman on investment opportunities in Mozambique the Frontline S ates agreed last month not

to condemn Chissano if he meets with Bc ha

Comment: Pragmatism on both sides appears to be behind the moves toward greater cooperation, but ic hightranding mutual mistrust over security issues will slow further improvements. Maputo views the successful reopening of the Cahora Bass: complex as a key signal of South African good faith in restraining RE NAMO but probably overestimates Pretoria's ability to control the insurgents. Chissano probably sees a summit as his lone bargaining chip and is not likely to agree to a meeting until he believes that I faputo's concerns about.
