Visa case of Masyl Jankiw (aka Yarcalaw STETZED)

You will recall that EE has recommended over the past several years that the various applications made by Yaroslav Statako for visitor's visa to the US be handled by delaying tactics. To our knowledge, however, no formal decision has ever been taken on his application.

EE tentatively believes that Stetsko's entrance into the US would be prejudicial to the public interest. However, before recommending that Stetsko <u>formally</u> be denied a visa unier Section 212(a)(27) of the Nationality Act, EE suggests that the factual information regarding Stetsko and the views of the other interested government agenties be requested. Wetsko has established some influential friends in the US, who are not all aware of his background, grounds for denial for a visa to him should be well documented. In addition to any other checks which VD may wish to make on Stetsko the following features of his career might with some profit be checked through CIA, PRI, and DOD (CIC):

1) Stetako's role in the Ukrainian Government which was established in Lemberg in 1941; character of this government, particularly its relationship to the Masi Government and its policies toward the people. (There are persistent stories that upwards of 130,000 Ukrainians were assassing ted by the government in the few weeks it was in power.)

2) The activities of Statsko and his political organisations in intimidating entire refugee camps in the post war years; the use of assaudnations and gangster-like methods to keep Ukrainians in line during this period; the extent and nature of Maffia-type operations, possibly extending into the US; and Statsko's connections and control over these forces.

3) Attitudes of Statuko and the press organs controlled by him toward the foreign policies and objectives of the US.

4) Probable impact on the Ukrainian Community of Stetako's entrance into the US.

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TANKER RELEASE

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When all the evidence appears to be available on Mr. Statistic EE would be pleased to review the case with W0 with a view to reaching a final desision on his application for visa. In the meantime, if there are phases of the investigation with which RE could be of assistance please let us know,

EE recommends that no answer be made to Mr. Stetuko's letter to the "hite House of July 25, 1956.

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
