> 4. The working committees, established by the Scientific Intelligence Committee and operating under its overall jurisdiction, will have, in their specific fields of scientific intelligence, the following basic responsibilities, and such others as may be deemed necessary by the Scientific Intelligence Committee:

> > a. formulation of national requirements;

b. preparation of interdepartmental production plans with fullest coverage of this field, guided by the principle of avoiding unnecessary duplication and overlap;

c. evaluation of the adequacy of collection activities with the object of achieving fullest coordination to neet national requirements in accordance with NSCID's Nos. 2 and 10;

d. allocation, by agreement of the IAC agencies, of responsibilities for production by the various participating agencies;

e. informing of the interested agencies of work in progress;

f. naintenance of the fullest exchange of available information:

g. preparation of coordinated reports, showing IAC concurrence or non-concurrence, which present the best available intelligence.

5. The Chairman of the Scientific Intelligence Conmittee will become the coordinator for Chapter VII of the National Intelligence Survey.

6. Liaison will be established with the Research and Developnent Board to ascertain its requirements and plan appropriate means for their resolution.

7. Any problem which cannot be resolved satisfactorily by the Scientific Intelligence Connittee will be referred, with appropriate recommendations, to the DCI for consideration by the Intelligence Advisory Connittee.
