LASZLO TARNO1

On March 1, 1967, Mr. Roy Mitchell, Chairman, Liberal Arts Department, Nohawk Valley Community College, Utica, New York, advised that Dr. Laszlo Tarnoi was a parttime Professor at this school from the beginning of the Fall term of 1965 to the end of the Spring term in 1966. He stated that Tarnoi had taught courses in Comparative Government and History of Western Civilization during this period.

He further stated that Dr. Tarnoi had departed from the Mohawk Valley Community College voluntarily and indicated an intention to teach at the Pembroke State College in Pembroke, North Carolina.

Tarnoi, according to Mitchell, had previously indicated that from 1956 until 1964, he had been a guest professor in Mexico, Chile, Brazil and Venezuela. Further, Dr. Tarnoi had indicated he had arrived in the United States during 1964 and had studied U. S. Institutions and Advanced English at Georgetown University, Washington, D.C.

According to Mitchell, Dr. Tarnoi had indicated he subsequently taught at Cornell College, Mount Vernon, Iowa, at Hamilton College, Clinton, New York, during the Fall of 1964 and Spring of 1965 term, and at the Utica College of Syracuse University, Utica, New York, before starting at Mohawk Valley Community College.

His birth data was indicated as May 25, 1912, in Hungary.

Mr. Mitchell concluded by noting he knew of nothing unfavorable regarding Dr. Tarnoi, that his exact marital status was unknown, but it was believed Tarnoi had intended to enter
