The New York Police Department (NYPD) requests the temporary assignment of an intelligence community analyst to assist the Department in establishing a terrorist assessment analytical unit. The unit will serve several purposes:

- Assist the Department in staying abreast and evaluating whether or how terrorist-related developments abroad will impact on New York City.
- Provide analytic support to NYPD training programs designed to broaden and deepen counter-terrorism awareness at the patrol and above level.
- In conjunction with the Joint Terrorism Task Force, provide collection guidance on terrorism related matters to NYPD Field Intelligence Officers who interact with department personnel at the precinct level.
- Serve as a conduit and assessment center for open source and, as appropriate, classified analytic materials on terrorism and counter-terrorism related issues from the intelligence and law enforcement communities.

We believe the addition of such an analytic unit would fill a major void in NYPD efforts to strengthen its counter-terrorism programs. The availability of an intelligence community analyst with experience on terrorist issues would be of immense value in helping us train NYPD personnel to do the job of this new unit. In addition to training, we would rely on such an individual to help identify the best terrorist-related open source materials available, worthwhile contacts in the academic and other communities and advise in establishing appropriate data bases.

We expect that a temporary assignment of no more than six months would fill this critical need.

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
