2d Lt. Charles C. Michaelis and Lt.  $(j_{C})$  Fred Foster are each authorized an excess bage gage allowance of one hundred (100) pounds for special 0.5555 equipment. Under no conditions will personal baggage be crated or boxed for shipment to the port.

6. Fayment of per diem in lieu of subsistence in accordance with existing law and regulations is authorized; payment of monetary allowances in lieu of rations and quarters at the rate prescribed in Section 1 of Executive Order 9386, as published in Section II. Bulletin No. 19, WD, 21 October 1943, is authorized enlisted men for such periods of travel as 11 is impracticable for them to be quartered and rationed with trueps.

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7. The Transportation Corps will furnish the necessary transportation. TDN: 1=5000 P 451-01, 02, 03, 07, 08 A 0425-24.

8. The Personnel Officer this headquarters will process Service Records of Army enlisted men in accordance with paragraph 40, Changes No. 13, AR 345-125, deted 21 April 1943. Service Records and allied papers will be placed in the custody of the officer in charge of movement.

9. Personnel involved in this movement will furnish their correspondents, at the eppropriate time, that their post office address until further notice will be;

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The Postal Officer this headquarters will take the necessary action to insure proper delivery of mail.

10. Each individual in this shipment is cautioned to refrain from discussing the overseas destination of this movement, even by shipment number, as the meaning thereof may later become known by correspondents and the security provided be violated.

11. Reimbursement for the expenses incurred in connection with this travel will be made to the Mar Department by the Office of Strategic Services.
