Wayne J. McNulty died in August 1968, when a helicopter in which he was a passenger landed in a rice paddy in Laos. He was shot to death by a sniper.

(%) Wayne McNulty, a native of Columbus, Montana, joined the US Army in 1940 as a First Lieutenant. He served in World War II as a regimental intelligence and reconnaissance platoon leader. Honorably discharged in 1946, he became a self-employed salesman of electrical appliances while also taking college courses. In 1952, McNulty was recalled to active duty. The Army sent him on assignments to Australia, New Guinea, the Philippines, Japan, Germany, and Vietnam. He retired from the military in 1966 as a Lieutenant Colonel.
