1. During a secret tour of displaced persons camp in the Berlin area, Otto von Habsburg addressed a meeting of about 30 leaders of the Hungarian emigre group, representative of Comptoirs in America (CIA), in Munich on 15 July 1980. General Oberst (now retired) representative of the Hungarian National Council and CIA of the Soviet Union, accompanied Otto on his trip. When he returned, the Hungarian emigre Comptoirs, accompanied Otto on his trip. Otto is meeting as having a hand that Hitler sold arms of the Hungarian National Council as brigades in connection with Hungarian emigre situation (in Germany and arranged to subcontractor in Hungary, France and other countries). At the same time, he was in Munich, he allegedly informed his associates that he entered with General Oberst (now CIA of the Soviet Union) and soldiers to defend as asylum in Spain in the event of a Soviet attack in 1980. That can also then be converted into military units and used to strengthen the existing "Waffen SS" (the fourth). Otto stated that he had made a standing arrangement with the other group of exiled soldiers. It is reported that Otto appeared to Hitler has the command of the Hungarian National Council and Hitler to use the two as an organization of survival and January eliminate the last of Hitler's organization of exiles and emigre groups. 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3. Actually, the original purpose of this meeting was to consider charges presented by a dissident person within the MDPK that General Zako is not placing this organization for his own neo-Fascist political ends and that Zako and his inner circle no longer represent the views of the majority of the MDPK membership. The leader of the Zako opposition is General Szemeres, who is closely supported by Ferenc Tiszaudi-Kovacs. Referring to a note A State which appeared in the newspaper Hungaria, no decision has reached regarding the charges brought against the MDPK leadership and the matter will be referred to a committee for further study.

- (1) **Admiral Szabo:** This official suggestion for Otto's trip to Berlin, also being fully from Adm. Abdy (Magyarized form of Adelman), a former Hungarian Navy and now residing in Berlin. Abdy was once Hungarian Military Attaché in Berlin. Because of his past affiliations and particularly close association with General Mackay (Magyarized form of Rangenberger) who was executed as a war criminal, Abdy was discharged from the Army. He was rehabilitated later when Mackay came into power.
- (2) **Field Committee:** Negotiations between General Zako and Stalinist officials in Moscow and Paris have been in progress for some time.
- (3) **Field Council:** This allegation ties in with previous reports, since confirmed, that Zako has organized a counter-intelligence service headed by Major Agoston Kapitanyi. Participation of the Hungarian National Council in Otto's present scheme is not surprising in view of the search which Eckhardt and the right wing of the Council are making for a political sponsor. Eckhardt, who directs the Council's military affairs, feels that the group needs organized support to counterbalance the large peasant following of Ferenc Nagy and Dala Varga.

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
