We have never forgotten you, although you are entitled to feel some neglected. After receiving word about you from Miss Ycas of the Legation and receiving your letter I tried all the ways I could discover to aid you in some way. I put off writing till I could give you some hope. I talked with Felix Frankfurter and some of the Rockefeller people then in Washington and at that time I could get nowhere. Recently a very, very good friend of mine accepted a position with the State Department here. I have interested him in helping you and he indicates the first ray of hope. He has connections with the Rockefeller people in addition to his job and thinks some action is possible.

Don't count too much but we will try our best. What can I send you that would be helpful and possible to get delivered — soap? fats? clothing? or cigarettes for exchange? We think of you and Marile often. Please give her our love. We are praying for you both and sincerely hope that some way will be found to bring you here.
