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




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LITERATURE REVIEW ON NON-LETHAL INCAPACITATION

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Technology exchanges with NASA

the Office of Development and Engineering At irregular intervals we have responded to requests for briefing cleared NASA personnel. The majority of those meetings were with NASA Headquarters people with the exception of the LST exchanges which included GSFC and MSFC people. Two specific technologies have been released to them as unclassified work: a) The photo diode chips (not including modules or higher level assemblies, b) The control moment gyros (the hardware from the 1970 technology development).

At irregular intervals we have requested assistance rom NASA, generally from GSFC via the NASA Headquarters cleared personnel. Two examples are: a) the packaging/ QC/parts review by two eared NASA GSFC engineers, (b)(3)b) the TWT consultation by one NASA GFSC engineer at Agency Secret classification. In no case have we touched on programmatic matters and all activities have had a scheduled, controlled duration supervised (b)(3)There are no /current activities of this nature.

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
