### US State Dept Travel Advisory

### Passport/Visa Requirements

US citizens should make sure their passport will not expire for at least 6 months after they enter the country even if they do not intend to stay that long. They should also make sure they have at least 1 blank page in their passport for any entry stamp that will be required. A visa is not required as long as you do not stay in the country more than 89 days.

An International Certificate of Vaccination for yellow fever is required for travelers arriving from countries with a risk of yellow fever transmission and for travelers having transited through the airport of a country with risk of yellow fever transmission. See WHO recommendations.

<b>Potable Water</b>	Yes, some opt for bottled water outside the cities.
<b>International Driving Permit</b>	Suggested; additionally, traveler will need to present their US driver's license & IDP to local police to pay a special registration fee
<b>Road Driving Side</b>	Left
<b>Tourist destinations</b>	Brimstone Hill Fortress National Park; National Museum; Alexander Hamilton House; Mount Liamuiga Volcano; Clay Villa Plantation House & Gardens; Timothy Hill Overlook; Romney Manor
<b>Major Sports</b>	Cricket, rugby, netball, soccer, cue sports
<b>Cultural Practices</b>	Avoid wearing shorts except on the beach. Professional, modest attire is expected in a business setting.
<b>Tipping Guidelines</b>	Most hotels and restaurants add a service charge of 10% to cover tipping. If not, add a tip of 10-15% of the total bill.
