### US State Dept Travel Advisory

The US Department of State currently recommends US citizens **DO NOT TRAVEL** to Belize due to COVID-19. Exercise increased caution in Belize due to crime. Some areas have increased risk. ### Passport/Visa Requirements

US citizens should make sure their passport is valid at the date of their entering the country and during the length of their entire visit. They should also make sure they have at least 1 blank page in their passport for any entry stamp that will be required. A visa is not required for stays of less than 30 days.

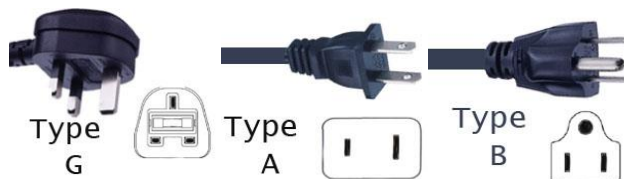
Tropical; very hot and humid; rainy season (May to November); dry season (February to May)

<b>Road Driving Side</b>	Right
<b>Tourist destinations</b>	Ambergris Caye; Lighthouse Reef Atoll & the Blue Hole; Turneffe Islands Atoll; Cockscomb Basin Wildlife Sanctuary; Mountain Pine Ridge Forest Reserve
<b>Major Sports</b>	Soccer, basketball, sailing
<b>Cultural Practices</b>	Haggling is uncommon and considered rude, except at street markets.
<b>Tipping Guidelines</b>	A tip between 15-20% is appropriate in restaurants and bars. Tipping taxi drivers is typically rare because metropolitan prices are low. A tip somewhere between 5-15% of the total bill is appropriate for hotel staff.
