#### **Tipping Guidelines**

It is acceptable to tip 10-15% at a restaurant if no service charge is included. Tip bellhops \$1 (USD) per bag for carrying luggage to your room; leaving a small tip for housekeeping is appreciated. Tipping is not required for taxi drivers.
