In 1918, the Slovenes joined the Serbs and Croats in forming a new multinational state, which was named Yugoslavia in 1929. After WWII, Slovenia was one of the communist republics in the restored Yugoslavia. The country became independent in 1991. Slovenia acceded to NATO and the EU in 2004 and joined the euro zone and the Schengen Area in 2007.
