INTRODUCTION

During the 10th and 11th centuries, Ukraine was the center of Kyivan Rus, the largest and most powerful in Europe. Upon dissolution of the USSR in 1991, Ukraine achieved independence, but the legacy of state control stalled efforts at economic reform, privatization, and civil liberties. Ukraine is fiercely resisting the 2022 Russian invasion, which has destroyed infrastructure and caused a humanitarian crisis.
