| Passport/Visa<br>Requirements       | US citizens should make sure their passport will not expire for at least 6 months<br>after they enter the country even if they do not intend to stay that long. They<br>should also make sure they have at least 1 blank page in their passport for any<br>entry stamp that will be required. A visa is not required as long as you do not stay in<br>the country more than 89 days.  |
