<b>US State Dept Travel Advisory</b>	The US Department of State currently recommends US citizens <b>DO NOT TRAVEL</b> to Estonia due to COVID-19. <b>Passport/Visa Requirements</b>	US citizens should make sure their passport will not expire for at least 6 months after they enter the country even if they do not intend to stay that long. They should also make sure they have at least 1 blank page in their passport for any entry stamp that will be required. A visa is not required.

<b>Major Sports</b>	Soccer, basketball, skiing, volleyball, cycling, judo
<b>Cultural Practices</b>	It is considered rude to greet someone while seated, stand up to introduce yourself.
<b>Tipping Guidelines</b>	If you do not like the service you do not need to tip. A 10% tip is polite and in many places expected for satisfactory or good service; a 20% tip is considered a thank you for exceptional service.
